We will compare materials, designs, and play styles across history, learning about technological and cultural changes. This topic builds historical enquiry skills through timelines, hands-on activities, and discussions about childhood past and present.

#### LLC

- **Focus writing:** Recount
- **Skills:** First and third person, Past tense, Time connectives, Nouns/expanded noun phrases, Pronouns, Adjectives, Adverbs / Adverbial phrases, Formal language
- **Reading:** Read and understand increasingly complex texts; Infer meaning, interpret figurative language, and evaluate how language shapes understanding.

#### Maths

- **Addition and subtraction:** Use written methods to add and subtract two 4-digit numbers with and without exchanging. Estimating answers, using different methods to check calculations.
- **Multiplication and division:** Understanding multiples, times tables and division facts, Focusing on 3, 6, 9, 7, 11 & 12 times tables.
- **CLIC:** Partitioning and understanding 3 and 4 digit numbers, counting in 10s, 20s, 25s, 50s, 100s, 250s from different starting numbers. Know half of 300, 500, 700, 900. Smile multiplication methods, using multiplication facts to divide.

#### Health and Wellbeing

- **Celebrating differences:** Judging by Appearances, Understanding Influences, Understanding Bullying, Problem-Solving, Special Me, Celebrating Difference: How We Look
- **Physical- Jumping and Landing, Seated Balance:** Develop and apply jumping and landing skills and seated balances through focused skill development sessions, Healthy competition, Cooperative games, and Group Personal Best challenges.
- Cooperate well with others, and Give helpful feedback

#### Science and Technology

- **Electricity:** Recognize everyday devices that use electricity. Build basic circuits and name components—cells, wires, bulbs, switches, buzzers. Understand that a lamp lights only if it's part of a complete circuit with a battery. Learn that a switch controls the circuit. Identify conductors and insulators.
- **Our Digital World:** Use different techniques to enhance our researching online. Develop a basic understanding of copyright issues. Learn how to reference material found online. Begin using online survey tools.

#### Expressive Arts

**3D** – Use a variety of materials to create a sculpture and/or model, e.g. recycled materials, clay. We will design and construct our own toys, exploring shape, structure, and function using imagination and the art of others' to inspire us.

#### Humanities

- **Enquiry & Interpretation:** Ask questions and use sources to explore toys from Tudor times and today. Spot similarities and changes in materials, technology, and values.
- **Chronological Awareness:** Place toys in time order. Use time-related words and understand historical periods.
- **Change & Continuity:** Explain why toys changed and what stayed the same. Link toys to children's lives and roles in Tudor times.
- **Communication & Collaboration:** Share findings in different ways. Work together to compare toys and use key history words like artefact and monarch.
- **Place & Culture:** Understand how toys show cultural values. Compare children's lives across time to build empathy.

#### Home learning

- Weekly reading, Spelling and Times Table practise.
- Make a presentation about your rights, what are they, why are they important.
- Interview time- ask your family what their favourite toy was growing up.
- Research and develop and understand of why toys have changed over time.
- Design and make your own toy.
- Write a diary entry of a fun day you have had recently.
