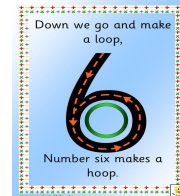
This week, our theme will focus on Wales.

This week, we will be practicing **writing the number 6** and learning how to form it carefully. We will use our **pencils, fingers, and fun activities** to help us practice!



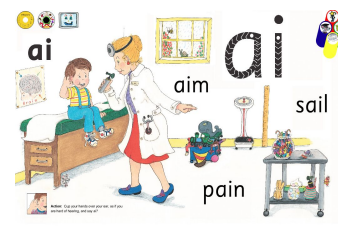
Jolly Phonics
