We had so much fun in our Reception Sports day, we were so lucky to have a the sun shining too!

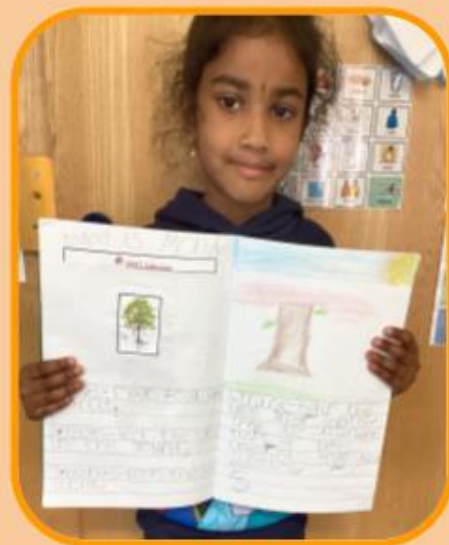
Year 1 2024-2025

Summer 2- "Seeds, Soil and Sunshine"

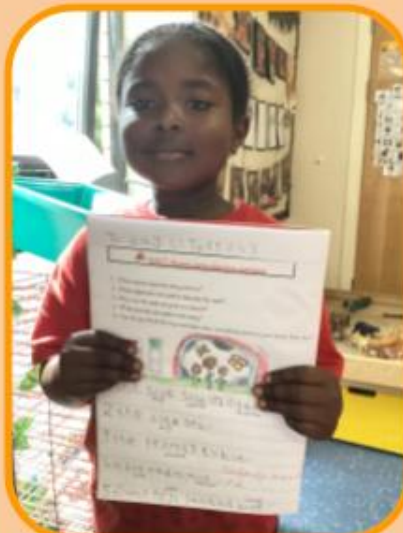


To launch our topic we went on a school trip to Cosmeston Lakes and Penarth Pier

Summer 2- "Water, Puddles and Ponds"

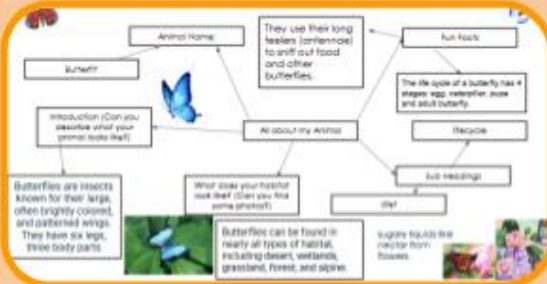
We carried out an investigation to find out which materials were waterproof.

Summer 2- "To Infinity and Beyond"

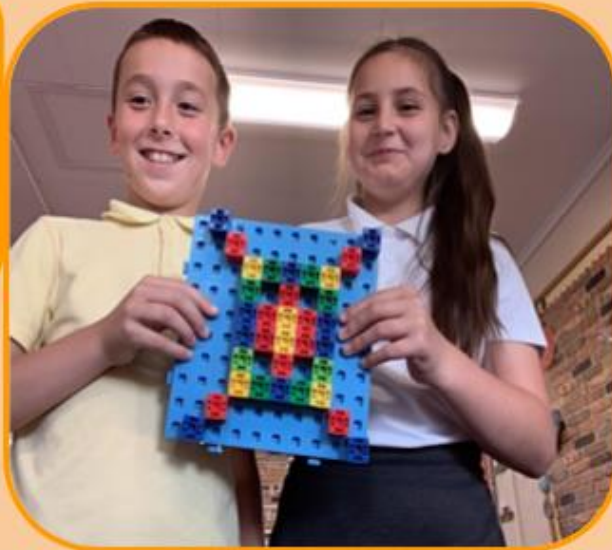


We spent lots of time reading about Space!

In missions, we have used the Sphero Indies to navigate through the solar system.

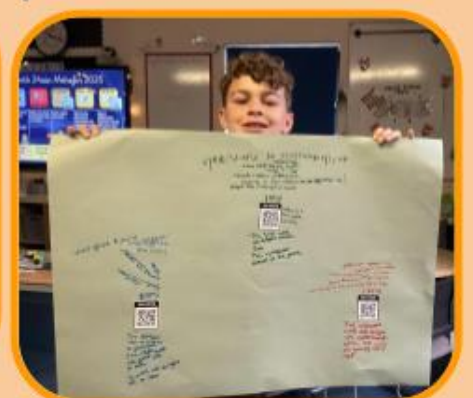
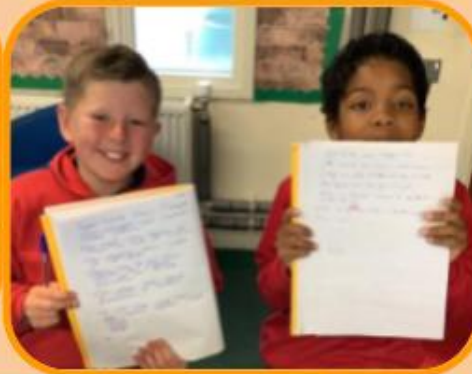


In missions, we trained like astronauts!



Year 5 2024-2025

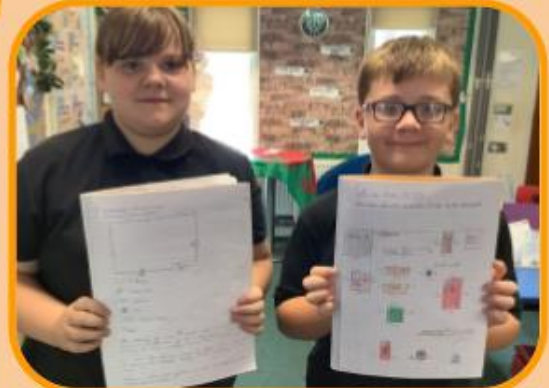
Summer 2- "All the Fun of the Fair!"
